I enclose a confidential memorandum on the internal situation in Rajputana and Ajmer-Merwara for the period ending the 15th July 1927.

MEMORANDUM.

Mewar.—My memorandum (No. 8) of 15th June 1927. Mr. G. C. Trench, Settlement and Revenue Officer, Mewar, reports that as the result of a good deal of persuasion, assisted by the presence of troops route marching in the Thikana, the tenants

withdrew their resignations and decided to appeal against their rents. Precautions will still be taken, but it is hoped the trouble will blow over if Pathik can be kept out of the Gwalior and Indore villages in the neighbourhood. The political authorities concerned have been asked to move the Darbars concerned to assist Mewar in the matter.

The Moharram passed off quietly in Rajputana and in the districts of Ajmer and Merwara.
